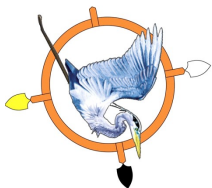

## Boy Scout Resident Camp

In addition to a great variety of merit badges and exciting open programs for all Scouts, our Boy Scout Summer Camp at Camp Chief Little Turtle promotes unit integrity by offering outstanding programs for Scouts of all ages and ranks. Two special programs are listed below:

**Turtle Quest (first-year camper) Program** is designed to help Scouts gain familiarity with the summer camp program and Scouting in general. Scouts participating in this program will work on skills needed for advancement up to and including **First Class and will have the opportunity to earn merit badges.** This program serves as a perfect introduction to the wonderful world of Scouting and the participants have fun doing it!

**Top Scout Program** offers a challenge to the older Scout. It is designed with the needs and interests of the older Scout in mind. Participants will take part in COPE experiences, canoe trip, travel the camp in a variety of special activities, experience rock climbing, mountain biking, and a variety of other activities. This program meets each day of the week and allows Scouts the time needed to earn merit badges.



## Cub Scout Camp

**Cub Scout Day Camp** is a day program for Wolf, Bear, and Webelos Scouts held at different locations within the Anthony Wayne Area Council area and features theme-related activities. Programs may include archery, BB guns, team and individual Cub Scout sports, crafts, nature, Cub Scout skills, and special guests. Each location offers unique activities and events but every camp will be **FUN FILLED!**
