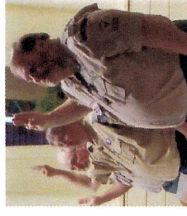

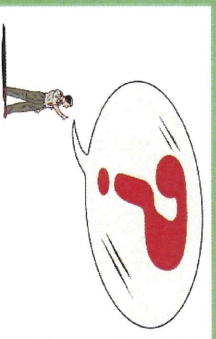


WHY SHOULD I ATTEND ROUNDTABLE?
