Kiskakon Service Awards

The current service awards were developed in a large part by Jeff Newman, arrowman and a past Chief of Kiskakon Lodge. The “Service Awards” recognize dedicated arrowmen that take on greater roles within the lodge that help build and strengthen the traditions of Kiskakon Lodge and the Order of the Arrow.

There are presently four areas in the lodge that comprise the “Service Awards” program.

A special fifth category recognizes the recipient(s) of the Wischixin Award with a yellow service pin that is worn on the service award patch. *Wischixin* is a Delaware word that translates to “active one”. The Wischixin recognition is awarded annually by the lodge leadership to arrowmen for meritorious service.

Arrowmen who qualify for recognition in any one or more categories should submit the completed form(s) through their chapter or lodge by the December LLD day to receive recognition at the next Winter Banquet.

The arrowman’s first award will be presented with a special lower pocket patch with the appropriate pin. Arrowmen may earn any number or multiple service pins in the years ahead.

This award can be earned once by youth or adult lodge members as appropriate.

Arrowmen will receive a unique special edition neckerchief that symbolizes commitment to the Lodge's Ceremony or Elangomat programs in Anthony Wayne Area Council.

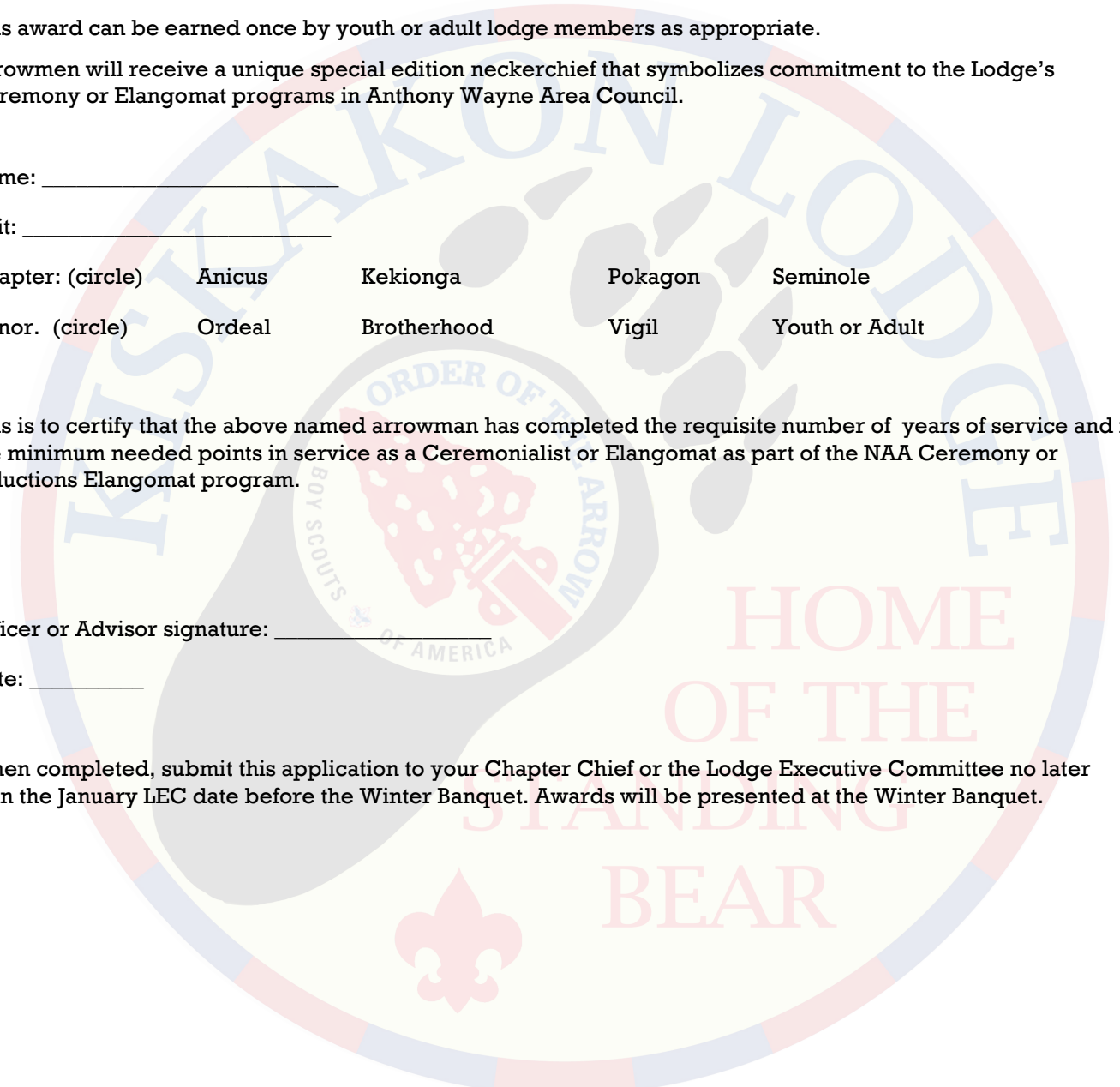
